### DIVISION IV BOYS

It wasn't expected to be pretty for Cloverdale at Salesian and it wasn't. It could have been worse if it wasn't for the running clock in the fourth quarter as the teams combined for six points. Cloverdale season ends 16-9.

There was a little nervous feeling at Cardinal Newman when they fell behind 9-2. By the end of the first quarter they led 13-12 and were on the way to the first round win.

The regular dynamic duo led the way for Cardinal Newman with Bobby Sharp scoring 18 and Xavier McCall adding 16. Sharp scored the last six points of the first quarter to give Cardinal Newman their first quarter lead. Lick Wilmerding's last lead was 24-23 with three minutes left in the half. Cardinal Newman then scored 19 straight to take their biggest lead 42-24. The lead didn't get under 10 after that.

Healdsburg had 24 turnovers in the loss to Marin Catholic. Despite that they hung in there for a while. Peter Nelsen banked in a three pointer from half-court at the buzzer to tie the game at 14 after the first. It was still 17-17 with 5 minutes left in the half, but a three pointer by Patrick Convoy gave Marin Catholic the lead for good. By halftime it was 37-28 and a 22-6 third quarter put things away.

Nelsen led the Hounds with 18 points as their season ends at 11-15.

Marin Catholic is now 19-10 and goes for win 20 Saturday Night at Cardinal Newman who went to 24-5.
