With two state champions and a number of other quality programs hailing from the region, it can be difficult to narrow the talent down to 15 players. However, after watching games throughout the year and a bit of research, the NCP Staff has chosen its three All-NorCal teams for the 2010-2011 season.

First Team

Brittany Boyd SR. G Berkeley

Boyd has had a busy post-season thus far in garnering numerous awards as she capped her high school career. The Berkeley guard won the NorCalPreps.com Player of the Year as well as Player of the Year from the Bay Area News Group. She was also named first-team, All-Metro by the San Francisco Chronicle as an all-around threat for the Yellowjackets with 15 points, six rebounds, five assists and six steals per game. She helped lead them to a 31-2 record and a Division I runner-up finish.

Hannah Huffman JR. G Carondelet

Huffman solidified herself as the top junior in the region with a very good junior season which saw her take her game to another level in the post-season. The recent Notre Dame commit is the NorCalPreps.com Division I Player of the Year and made first-team, All-Metro by the San Francisco Chronicle. The EBAL co-MVP went for 16 points, six rebounds, three assists and three steals and boosted her scoring average to more than 30 points in the NorCal playoffs. She helped Carondelet reach the Division I NorCal finals after moving up from Division II this year.

Hailie Eackles SR. G Pinewood

A player who could have easily won the NorCal Player of the Year honors, Eackles was dominant for Pinewood in helping the school win its second straight Division V state title. The Pacific-bound guard averaged 23 points, eight rebounds, two assists and two steals in being named Player of the Year by the San Francisco Chronicle and the San Jose Mercury News. In her final high school game against St. Bernard, she went for 31 points with four three pointers and grabbed nine rebounds.

Chairese Culberson SR. F Berkeley

The second player for the Yellowjackets on the first-team, Culberson came back from injury this year to be a difference maker in their playoff run to the state title game before losing to mythical national champion Mater Dei. She was a first-team selection by the Bay Area News Group and the San Francisco Chronicle as she ends her high school career to head to San Diego State next year.

Erimma Amarikwa SR. F Vanden

Despite a SJS Division III runner-up finish and a NorCal second round exit, Vanden was one of the top teams in the area throughout the year led by the play inside of Amarikwa. She averaged 22 points and 11 rebounds per game, including 31 points and 14 rebounds against Acalanes in the NorCal first round win. She is signed to play at San Diego State next year.

Second Team

Ali Gibson SR. G St. Mary's-Stockton

Tasked with leading a team having to replace a very strong senior core, Gibson stepped in to help the Rams win their third straight state title and first at the Division II level. The Oregon State signee was named the NorCalPreps.com Division II Player of the Year in averaging 16 points and four rebounds per game. She is also a finalist for the State Player of the Year award by CalHiSports.com.

Madeline Campbell SR. G Del Oro

The Sacramento Bee Player of the Year was the leader for the Golden Eagles, which made it all the way to the NorCal Division II finals as one of the top public schools in the area. She averaged 15 points, four

[Saidah Allen](#) SR. F Piedmont

A year after going compiling stellar statistics and leading Piedmont on a playoff run, Allen did it again as a senior in helping the Highlanders reach the NCS Division IV finals. Allen was the NorCalPreps.com Division IV Player of Year after totaling averages of 22 points, 19 rebounds, four assists and four steals. The Fresno State signee also made first-team, All-East Bay by the Bay Area News Group and first-team, All-Metro by the San Francisco Chronicle.

[Erica Payne](#) SR. F Carondelet

In sharing the EBAL MVP award with teammate Hannah Huffman, Payne capped her career at Carondelet which saw her play in two state finals. She averaged 13 points and eight rebounds in being named first-team, All-East Bay by the Bay Area News Group and second-team, All-Metro by the San Francisco Chronicle. She is signed to play at Stanford.

[Oderah Chidom](#) SO. Post Bishop O'Dowd

The NorCalPreps.com Division III Player of the Year was a key player for Bishop O'Dowd winning its first NorCal title in school history on the girls side despite graduating four Division I players. The first-team, All-East Bay selection by the Bay Area News Group averaged 11 points per game and had a 21 point-10 rebound-5 block showing against Sacramento in the NorCal championship game against Sacramento.

Third Team

[Devyn Weymouth](#) SR. G Lincoln-Stockton

The leader for Lincoln-Stockton this past season, Weymouth averaged 17 points, five rebounds, three assists and three steals as the Trojans went 27-5 and made it to the NorCal Division I finals. She had 22 points, three rebounds, three assists and three steals in a loss to St. Mary's-Stockton earlier this year. Weymouth is headed to Houston Baptist this fall.

[Briana Charles](#) SR. G St. Francis-Sacramento

The first-team, All-Metro selection by the Sacramento Bee was the go-to player for the Troubadours, which moved up to Division I and nearly made the NorCal finals before falling to Carondelet in semi-final play. She also won the Delta River League Player of the Year award for the No. 7 team in the region.

[Gabby Green](#) FR. G St. Mary's-Berkeley

The lone underclassman on the list, Green showed why she should be a fixture in NorCal basketball for the next three years with an impressive freshman campaign for the Division IV state runner-ups. She averaged 10 points per game on a balanced St. Mary's squad, including a sound all-around performance in the NCS Division IV finals. She was second-team, All-East Bay by the Bay Area News Group.

[Rayven Brooks](#) SR. F Dougherty Valley

Leading Dougherty Valley to the school's first section title, Brooks showed the versatility which made her one of the toughest match-ups in the region. She averaged 15 points, five rebounds and four assists and helped lay the groundwork for one of the best up and coming programs in the Northern California. Brooks was first-team, All-East Bay by the Bay Area News Group and second-team, All-Metro by the San Francisco Chronicle.

[Kendall Kenyon](#) SR. F St. Mary's-Stockton

Showing some potential last season, Kenyon took her game to another level as a senior in averaging 14 points and nine rebounds to give the Rams an inside presence en route to winning their third straight state title. Among her accomplishments this year include setting a NorCal Division II title game record with 20 rebounds in the win over Del Oro.
